With access to detailed information on children with hearing and visual impairments you can effectively monitor and meet pupils changing needs.

Information, including the nature and category of the impairment, can be easily shared across authorised teams to maximise pupils learning opportunities, raise achievement and improve outcomes for every child. To monitor impact, graphical audiograms can be generated against historical data ensuring services and support continues to meet pupils' needs.

With the added benefit of maintaining a complete record of services and equipment provided to children, administration time can be significantly reduced. Monitoring of inventory is made simple with records of equipment loans and details of testing and maintenance recorded centrally. Other administration tasks can also be completed such as compiling the data needed for the child-level element of the BATOD survey.
